


Pennsylvania Judicial Center

PACM is a non-profit professional organization established in 1989 through the consolidation of two predecessor organizations, the *Pennsylvania Council of District Court Administrators* and the *Pennsylvania Association of Court Administrators for Courts of Initial Jurisdiction*.

PACM members are state and county court employees involved in the management of the sixty judicial districts which comprise the Unified Judicial System of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

PACM Accomplishments
